We can work with small quantities of fibre, transforming it into the finest quality pure and blended woollen yarns for weaving, machine knitting and handknitting.

We Can Process Large Batches

We can work with large quantities of fibre from 1,000kg and above, with good turnaround times, for trade customers. We can provide project management services if required, linking with weavers, dye houses and other industry contacts to ensure you receive the finished product you desire.

Our completion times for turning raw fleece into beautiful yarn are quick by industry standards with a turnaround time of between 38 and 59 days, subject to specification, from the initial scour to fulfilment of the order.

We can supply bespoke prototype machine knitted samples and swatches in your finished yarn.

Adding Value

If you have your own supply of raw fleece/fibre and need some more to meet our minimum quantity requirements we can source additional fibre to make up your order.

We can add fibre to produce different shades, soften or strengthen yarns. We can also add in other fibres such as bamboo, Tencel and other natural materials.

We can produce the widest range of finished yarns, from Fine to Chunky weight.

Research and Development Trials

Our inhouse expertise has enabled us to create new and bespoke samples from blends of natural materials such as Dog Hair; Raw Nettle; Human Hair; Yak, Guanaco and Llama fibre mixed with different types of pure wool. We offer a R&D trialling service to experiment with less familiar and emerging natural fibres.
